Duties:

- Receive unsolicited submissions of books (approximately 15-20 per year) not previously reviewed on *TESL-EJ*.
- Work with the author to develop an informative review of a recently published book, pointing out its strengths and weaknesses, as well as the contribution that it makes to the field.
- Edit versions of submissions and the final submission 1) for clarity of expression and 2) formatting/mechanics.
- Submit the review to both the *TESL-EJ* Editor and Technical Editor.

 - While there is no hard deadline, we will close submissions once two new co-editors have been identified.
